SERVICES SPORTS CONTROL BOARD

History

This organisation was first started as the Army Sports Control Board (ASCB) in March 1919 on the same lines as the ASCB in U.K. The Commandant, Army School of Physical Training was appointed Honorary Secretary of the Board. Later the sports organisations of the three Services were amalgamated on 3rd April 1945 with the approval of the then Commander-in-Chief (C-in-C) and the Services Sports Control Board, SSCB was formed. Each Service was represented in this Board and constituted as following: -

President The Director of Military Training, Army Headquarters.

Secretary An officer holding the appointment of GSD-2 in the Military Training Directorate, Army Headquarters

Members An officer each from three Services (Army, Navy and Air Force).

- In the year 1947, the Chief of Staff Committee approved the reconstitution of Services Sports Control Board with an Inter-Services character. The three Services would now run the Services Sports Control Board in rotation for a tenure of three years. The tenure involved the change of President and Secretary. The three Joint Secretaries, one from each Service are generally for a tenure of four years.
- Elite players selected from the three services represent SSCB as 'SERVICES' team in various National championships/games.

SSCB since inception (1919) has given many legendary players to the country. Maj Dhyanchand, the Hockey wizard of India, and the 'Flying Sikh, Milkha Singh were from the 'Services'. SSCB is also the founder member of Indian Olympic Association and has a major role to play in its rise to the current state. SSCB is also member of 34 various National Sports Federations, member of BCCl and CISM (International Military Sports Council).

SSCB is the tri-services apex body which coordinates and promotes sports in the three Services for excellence and upliftment of sports at National and International levels.





36TH NATIONAL GAMES GUJARAT-2022



The 36th National Games were held from 29 Sep-12 Oct 22 in Gujarat after a gap of seven years. Earlier, it was hosted by Kerala in 2015. A total of 7,000 athletes across India participated in the National Games, which were played in six cities of Gujarat. Championship were held for 36 different games. SSCB participated in 26 games. The opening ceremony was held in Ahmedahad on Of Oct with Hon'ble PM as the Chief Guest, SSCR was the lead marching contingent in the parade and was led by **Gp Capt Dinesh Suri**, **Secretary, SSCB** who was also the **Chef de Mission** (CDM) of the delegation. The Services bagged a total of 128 medals comprising of 61 Gold, 35 Silver and 32 Bronze medals and established a clear lead over other states thus winning the coveted **Raja Bhalinder Singh trophy**.





INTERNATIONAL PARTICIPATION-2022

13th World Body Building & Physique Championship. Post the wonderful performance by Nb Subedar Arjun Kumar Sahu, who bagged Gold in 55 Kg weight category in 12th World Body Building Championship 2021 at Tashkent, Sub Anuj Kumar Taliyan (above 100 Kg), Sgt Ravinder Kumar Malik (85 Kg) both won Gold medals and Spr Nammi Marunaidu (75 Kg) won Silver medal in the Championship conducted from 06-12 Dec 22 at Phuket, Thailand.

World Para Swimming Championship. Havildar Binu G of Services participated in World Para Swimming Championship held at Berlin on O3 Apr 22 and won one Silver (200m) and one Bronze medal (100m Breast Stroke).

<u>South Asian Triathlon Championship</u>. The Services team won two medals (Gold-O1, Silver-O1) in the South Asian Triathlon Championship held from O1 to O3 Apr 22 in Nepal.

Asian Games Selection Trials for Archery players. In the Asian Games Selection trials for Archery conducted at SAI, Kolkata from 11-17 Jan 23, Hav B Dheeraj scored 1386/1440 in Recurve Men and broke World record of Bradly Eliason of USA, who had scored 1378/1440 points on 30 Apr 22 at Izbirna Tekmovanja

4th Ranking International Wrestling Tournament (Zouhaier Sghaier). The tournament was conducted at Tunisia from 14-17 Jul 22. Sgt Vicky & Sgt Deepanshu both won Silver Medals.

<u>World Senior Wrestling Championship 2022</u>. World Senior FS, GR & WW Championship 2022 was conducted at Serbia from 10-18 Sep 22. **Sgt Deepanshu, Sgt Pankaj & Sgt Vicky** represented India in the Championship.

Asian Water Polo Championship 2022. Asian Water Polo Championship 2022 was held in Thailand from 07-14 Nov 22. JWO Praveen GK represented India in the subject Championship.

International Referee (Boxing). Lt Col Kabilan Sai Ashok, Joint Secretary, SSCB had represented the country as a Refree & Judge in the Asian Elite Championship from 30 Oct - 10 Nov 22 in Jordan. He also represented the country in the IBA – Boxing Fight Night from 13 – 14 Dec 27 in Ahu Dhahi.















CISM



(CONSEIL INTERNATIONAL DU SPORTS MILITAIRE – FRENCH) (INTERNATIONAL MILITARY SPORTS COUNCIL – ENGLISH)

International Military Sports Council (CISM) was founded on 18 Feb the 1948 in France with an aim of promoting "friendship through sports" amongst the Armed Forces of member countries. It is today 140 member nations strong and is the 2^{nd} largest sporting body after International Olympic Council. It has its HQs in Brussels, India became its member in 1999 and has been regularly participating in its events. Only serving military personnel can participate in the competitions.

India hosted the 4th CISM MWG at Hyderabad & Mumbai from 14-21 Oct 07. The mascot was the 'Great Indian Bison'. A total of 101 countries with over 5700 athletes participated in the games. India won 2 Gold,1 silver and 7 bronze medals. Indian Services contingent also participated in the 2019 Military world games held in Wuhan, China.
